

How to...

MAKE A BIRD FEEDER

With
Suffolk Owl Sanctuary



MATERIALS

Pine cones
Peanut butter (check the ingredients for sustainable palm oil)
Bird seeds - a mix is best
Mealworms (optional)
Newspaper/ plate/ tray for rolling
Spoon for smooching
String for hanging up

MAKE

Use a spoon or your fingers to push peanut butter into all the gaps on the pine cones. When you have a good layer, tip some seeds and mealworms onto a plate/ tray/ piece of paper and roll the pine cones in the seed mix until thoroughly coated..



HANG UP

Tie a piece of string around the pine cone with enough length to hang up outside. If the peanut butter is a bit goeey, you can put the pine cones in the freezer. When you're ready, hang your pine cones up in the garden. They can be hung from a tree branch, an existing bird feeder or a hook in your fence



WAIT

It won't take long for birds to find your feeders. Why not keep a record of all the species you see using your feeder? Who do you expect to visit first/ most often?
