We are the smallest Australian mainland owl - we are about 30cms long and weigh about the same as two cricket balls!!

In Australia, the early settlers of New South Wales called us Mopoke Owls, Cuckoo Owls or Spotted Hawk Owls.

We have fantastic eyesight and hearing we can catch moths and bats in mid air!!

I live at the Suffolk Owl Sanctuary with lots of my
owlie friends. Here are some Boobook facts:

We look similar to a British Tawny Owl, with dark brown plumage streaked with white and bright yellow eyes.

Male Boobooks do not help to incubate eggs, but after young have hatched, they will help to feed them.

Because our cry sounds so sad, a common saying in Australia is "don't be a mopoke!" meaning don't be grumpy or unhappy.
